May 13 – *Ascension Day* at 7 p.m.

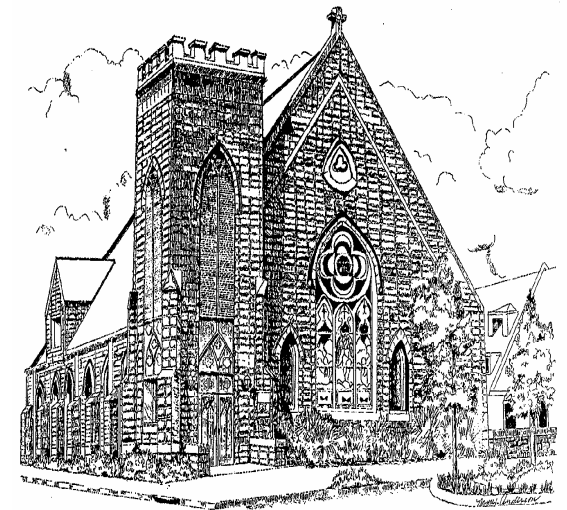
May 23 – *The Day of Pentecost* with the Holy Trinity Choir, and brass and organ at 10:30 a.m.
